Otago Cross-country Report 15 July 2006

The Otago Cross-country Championships were held at Waikouaiti Racecourse on a fine clear day with the course in excellent order for this time of year. It was a successful day for Caversham in terms of results and all competing club members acquitted themselves well.

In the Men Under 16 6000 metres Robert Brown ran a well judged race to win by 9seconds in a time of 20.13 from Daniel Belchin of Civil Service who led the race from the start with Caversham's Will Buchanan 3rd in 21.31 and Jeff Notman also of Caversham 4th in 22.02. Royce Madigan was 7th in 23.17. Caversham was a clear winner of the Teams race competition. The Masters Women's 45 6000 metres provided one of the most exciting finishes of the day with Caversham's Marion Maxwell prevailing by 2 seconds over Julie Wilson of Ariki with the pair being locked together throughout the race. Marion's time was an impressive 22.21 against Julie's 22.23. The Masters Men's race run over 8000 metres also provided a great contest with Glen Ferguson of Leith winning in 28.19 followed by Geoff Anderson of Caversham in 28.27 and Lachie Cameron of Ariki 3rd in 28.33. Geoff was thrilled with his run and particularly pleased to beat Lachie Cameron who is always a formidable competitor over cross country and road races. Good runs back in the field from Ian McDonald and John Landreth saw Caversham take 3rd place in

the Teams competition in this grade. In Senior Men's 12000 metres Clinton Coker ran another fine race continuing an excellent winter season for him and promising a good summer track season later in the year. Our two Senior Women's competitors Joanna Tokona and Kerry Rowley were both satisfied with their runs against tough opposition. Overall the Otago Crosscounrty results were encouraging for the Club with a number of major winter events still to come.
