Caversham member Paula Anstey secured her first National title on April 23rd when winning the Women's 50-54 grade in 2hr 46min at the National Duathlon Championships held at Fielding.

While the numbers in her age group were not great Paula was pleased to finish ahead of a number of women in lower age group which gave added satisfaction to her win. "It was nice to perform well after all the travel involved getting to Fielding" Paula says. The Duathlon comprised a 10k run, a 40k cycle and a 5k run held on an undulating course with strong winds making conditions tough especially on the cycle stage. "I had trained very hard right through the summer with this event in mind and all the conditioning work paid off handsomely on the day" Paula says.

### Leith Club Cross Country Relay 20th May 2006

There were a good number of Caversham teams competing in the Cross Country Relays organized by the Leith Harrier Club on a new course at the Dunedin Pony Club grounds on Three Mile Hill Road. The course was similar to some of the cross country venues of previous decades with some steep and undulating terrain providing a good test of fitness for all competitors. The Course received positive reviews with the proviso that some alterations may be needed for the Senior Men's course which run over a very tough three lap circuit.

The first Caversham team to perform with credit were the Boys U.16 team of Robert Brown, Jeff Notman, Ben Anderson and Royce Madigan who finished 2nd in their grade behind Hill City. Robert recorded the fastest time in this grade of 8.09 minutes.

The Caversham Master's Women's team finished a close second to Leith in their grade a reversal of the placings in the Lovelock Relays and an indication of the close rivalry that should be repeated in other races later in the season. Marion Maxwell recorded fastest time of 9.10and Gail, Maria and Christine all gained top marks for their efforts. The Caversham Senior Women's team competed in the same grade as the Masters team finished a short distance behind them. Kerry was fastest time with 9.55

Our U.12 team finished 6th out of 11 teams. They all enjoyed their run and the encouragement they received around the course. It's great that there are more children of this age taking part in these events and enjoying the experience without being pressured in any way.

The Senior Men's team with first year member Will Buchanan engaged in their own battle back in the field with Civil Service which they narrowly failed to win but which probably helped to encourage them along the way

The post event prize giving and afternoon tea went well with a comment overheard that the food provided was almost up to the standard set by Caversham. Club Captain John Landreth was a winner of one of the major spot prizes which will be in evidence for future mid winter training on dark nights.
