

There were a number of Caversham members who took part in the National Track and Field Championship in Wellington over the weekend of the 7th and 8th March. **Ben Anderson** was to gain Silver in the 800m finishing in a time of 1m51.35sec and 5th in the 1500m in 3m55.66sec In the 5000m **Peter Meffan** was 11th in 15m14.51sec and **Joshua Baan** 13th in 15m27.64sec. In the 3000 Steeplechase **Peter Meffan** was 6th in 9m47.05sec, the event was won by former Caversham member **Daniel Balchin** in 9m07.56sec.

I am absolutely amazed re China. The place just seems to work so well! I guess it is that there are so many that it has to.

Am in Zhenzghou, a city 5 times the area of Auckland and 8 million. There are electric scooters everywhere [am getting about on the back of one] with traffic allowing others thru cos that makes it work. It is like being on a dodgem without any banging into each other..!!!

The people are soooo friendly and I am having some wonderful experiences. The food is a bit high volume so I am getting them to understand that I am a moderate eater. I eat like a local in the markets where a friendly...ni hao / hello...she she [cher cher] / thank you...bye bye [global] gets me local prices and service

We use translation apps via mobile fones [my hosts gave me one to use all topped up] so it is very easy to communicate.

There is wifi at cafes, restaurants or McDonalds so that is good...tho I have 24/7 wi-fi in the service desk/foyer area of the 17 storey apartment building I am renting so I use that.

Went for a run the other day and received cheers and encouragement from the locals...well, I think it was that ??? [photos attached]
